While all sidewalks are important, those along Huntington Avenue especially need shoveling because pedestrians use them to get to the Huntington Metro Station. Second Notice – Inoperable Vehicles

A recent survey of the Huntington community turned up numerous violations of state regulations regarding operable/inoperable vehicles. To be sure that all residents, owners as well as renters, are aware of these regulations, we reprint the notice that appeared in our September newsletter.

Inoperable vehicles are cars, trucks, trailers, boats, etc., that do not have current Virginia state license tags and state inspection stickers or that are not in working condition. It is illegal to park or store inoperable vehicles on public or private property, including streets and driveways. Inoperable vehicles are subject to removal by the Impound Unit of the Fairfax County Police Department. All vehicles housed in Fairfax County are covered by these state regulations. New residents have 60 days from the date of establishing residence to obtain Virginia tags and an inspection. The violations noted above have been referred to the impound unit for enforcement.
