Lawns and the "Boulevards"

It's that time of year when our lawns are greening up and growing like crazy. Please remember that County Regulations state that grass cannot be longer than 12". While most lawns in our community look fantastic there are a few that are not properly maintained. Lawns must be maintained even if you rent the property. Please don't forget to mow and edge the "boulevard" or utility strip located between the sidewalk and street. Our community will have much more curb appeal if these boulevards are neat and tidy, especially along Huntington Avenue.

No Left turns from Lower Mt. Vernon Dr.

We realize it is easier to make the left from Lower Mount Vernon Drive to Huntington Avenue, but it is a TRAFFIC VIOLATION. The crest in the hill doesn't allow for a safe left hand turn – motorist cannot see you - that's why the signs are posted. Please respect the road conditions and make the left at the light on Farrington.

Foxes in Huntington

Although we are an urban neighborhood, many species of wildlife live in here too. Recently, there have been repeated fox sightings in lower Huntington. Foxes are primarily nocturnal; however they can adapt their behavior and become more active during the day. Foxes generally feed on berries, plants, insects, and small mammals. They may also eat pet food, garbage, and bird seed. Residents are encouraged to feed their pets inside their home and to keep them securely penned at night, if left outside. Foxes can carry rabies. If a resident observes a fox acting aggressively or oddly, they should not approach the fox, but rather contact Fairfax County Animal Control at 703-691-2131.
